

# Grand Knight's Message

Dear Brother Knights,

Advent season is upon us. It is the season in which we prepare for the Incarnation of our Lord. The most absurd thought to Jews and Pagans of ancient times. The idea that God would become man. In preparation for this most joyous occasion, we, as Catholic gentlemen, must raise our hearts and minds to Christ. As God humbled himself and became man, we must humble ourselves before our Lord.

Last month I wrote about the importance of prayer. This month I will speak about the sacrament of confession. Confession, like the other 6 sacraments, are interactions with God "by which divine life is dispensed to us." (CCC 1131) Whether we confess venial or mortal sins, this dispensing of the divine to the repentant sinner is true. When we confess our sins often in the sacrament of confession, we become aware of particular sins in our own lives. We then can humble ourselves and change parts of our lives to sin no more, with that specific sin. By frequenting the confessional often, we are graced by God to have the scales fall from our eyes. We can then recognize the log in our own eyes so that we may take it out.

Thus, brothers, it is essential to steep ourselves in our Catholic Traditions and Sacraments. Not because someone had told us to do so. Instead, when we hold fast to the teachings of Christ, our lives are molded to the image of Christ. When we are molded to Christ, we become closer to the beings whom God created us to be. Without the grace from the Sacraments, especially confession, how do we think that we can go out to serve the people in this world? With our focus not on Christ, we would serve the world for selfish reasons. Which ultimately amounts to nothing. Instead, by turning to the Sacraments, we may serve others not for selfish reasons but for the greater glory of God, which will transform the world.

As we enter the Advent season, let us prepare ourselves for the day that God Himself came down to earth. Let us humble ourselves by becoming like little children, such as God himself had done at Christmas, in the Incarnation. Let us give ourselves humbly to the sacraments for our own good and the good of the world.

May the Lord bless each of you during this Advent season and into the Christmas season.

Our next general meeting is on Dec 14th at 7:30pm. The meeting follows daily Mass, which is at 7:00pm at St. Peters Church.

Hope Springs Eternal,




Hope, Peace, Joy and Love are the weekly themes for Advent. Not to contradict St. Paul in his letter to the Corinthians,




